Coming Soon Food Service Inspection Reports

Hello!

Welcome to the Food Service Inspection Reports Page. We will soon be posting recent food service inspection reports for Bristol and Burlington. Our inspectors perform at least sixty inspections of restaurants and stores in our towns every month, and you should have the opportunity to see how they (and we) do.

Each report will consist of a line containing: Date of Inspection, Restaurant Name, a series of X's or 1's which will show which "critical inspection criteria" were reported by the inspector, and a final score of the inspection.

Below the table of reports will be an explanation of what each item noted means – each of them is an item that has been closely associated with outbreaks of foodborne disease. A score of 80 or above means "passing" as long as no "4-Point Violation" is noted. 4-point violations are noted above and below the columns in red.

Why have we not started posting the inspections yet? Well, we need to tell all our food establishments that we are going to post recent inspections on our web page, so that they aren't surprised.

A note of caution: Just because an inspection showed an X or a 1 in the report does not mean that the violation still exists. Restaurant conditions change daily, and it's MOST likely that it's already been corrected. Often, the violations are corrected while the inspector is still there. We still have to report them, however. That's how the state approved procedure is performed. Our inspectors are certified by the state Department of Public Health, so inspections are pretty consistent throughout Connecticut.

Use your judgment when reviewing the scores of your favorite restaurants. They generally do quite well. We recommend our restaurants and stores to our residents and visitors.
